Ba é an Sáirsint Bracken an sáirsint deireanach a chónaigh sa Bheairic, bhí sé lonnaithe ann ó 1977 go dtí 1984. Faoin am sin bhí an foirgneamh ag dul in olcas. Cáineadh é agus measadh nach raibh sé fóirsteanach chun cónaí ann.

I 1994 socraíodh go ndéanfaí áitreabh an Gharda Síochána béal dorais a oiriúnú mar stáisiún nua Gardaí. D'fhág na Gardaí an tsean bheairic agus ar feadh roinnt blianta, níor úsáideadh an bheairic.



Sergeant Bracken was the last sergeant to reside in the Barracks, he was stationed there from 1977 until 1984. By then the building was running into deterioration. It was condemned and deemed unsuitable for living in. In 1994 it was decided that the neighbouring Garda house premises be adapted as a new Garda station. The Gardaí left the former R.I.C. barracks and for a number of years, the barracks lay unused.

I 1998 rinne na Comhairleoirí Condae áitiúla, Pádraig Ó Ceallaigh agus Maureen Ní Dhubhchóin iarratas ar an Scéim Athnuachana Bailte agus Sráidbhaile don Fhál Carrach. Rinne an clár seo machnamh ar thodhchaí na beairice. Mar thoradh air sin, bhunaigh Cumann Turasóireachta & Trádálaithe an Fhál Carraigh fochoiste. Shocraigh siad an foirgneamh a cheannach agus é a athchóiriú chun ionad cultúrtha agus oidhreachta a chruthú. Ceannaíodh é ó Oifig na nOibreacha Poiblí ar £22,500.

In 1998 local councillors Paddy Kelly and Maureen Doohan secured the Village Renewal Scheme for Falcarragh. This programme gave consideration to the future of the barracks. As a result, the Tourist & Traders Association of Falcarragh formed a sub-committee. They decided to buy the building and refurbish it to create a cultural and heritage centre. It was purchased from the Office of Public Works for the sum of £22,500.

Coiste An tSean Bheairic Teo. was formed with direct responsibility for the restoration project. The company received financial support from the International Fund for Ireland, Údarás na Gaeltachta, An Roinn Ealaíon, Oidhreacht, Gaeltachta & Oileán, and the Donegal County Council.

I Meán Fómhair 2000, cuireadh tús le hobair athchóirithe ar an bheairic. Caomhnaíodh go leor den bunfhoirgnimh agus athchóiríodh é go cúramach. Sa lá atá inniu ann léiríonn sé stair dhraíochtúil, agus scrúdaítear stair Ghaeltacht Dhún na nGall.

San Ionad tá Áis Eolais faoin gceantar, Siopa Ceardaíochta, Spás Taispeántais d'ealaíontóirí agus tionscadail áitiúla, spásanna oibre do cheardaithe áitiúla agus halla éisteachta fá choinne damhsa, dráma agus léirithe ceoil. Tá Caifé ann freisin.

In September 2000, restoration work began on the barracks. Much of the original building fabric was preserved and its unique glory was carefully restored. Today it showcases an enchanting history and explores the history of the Donegal Gaeltacht. The Centre consists of an Information Facility about the area, a Craft Shop, and an exhibition space for local arts and projects. It includes workspaces for local craft workers and an auditorium for dance, theatre, and musical performances. It also houses a coffee shop.

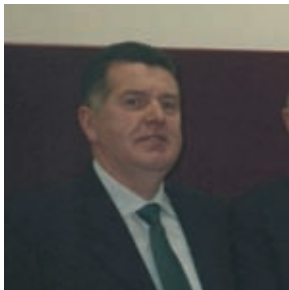

History of An tSean Bheairic



The Land War, in the 1880's and early 1890's had necessitated an increase in the police personnel throughout the Cloughaneely district. As a result a temporary station and police huts were located at Ballyconnell house and elsewhere throughout the area. The main barracks on the Ballyconnell road, a rented premise, was now no longer sufficiently large to accommodate the increased number of officers and their extra policing duties. One can only assume, that R.I.C. authorities considered it necessary to find a new location for a police barracks and that they approached Wybrants Olphert, whom they had served well during the evictions.

In the Registry of Deeds, we find that by 1891, Sir Andrew Reed of Dublin Castle, the Receiver General for the R.I.C. Constabulary Force in Ireland had been granted a new site on the Dunfanaghy road, by Wybrants Olphert;

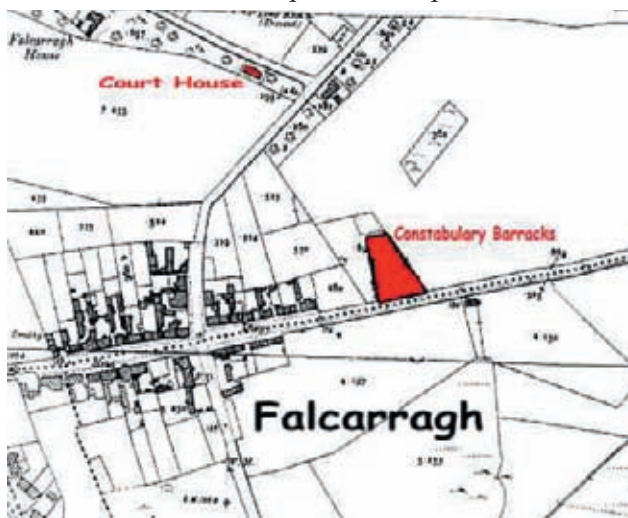


'For the purposes of the constabulary Force, for the term of ninety years, from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, at the yearly rent of eight pounds, subject to the several conditions covenants and agreements....'

In Griffith's Valuation of 1857, we find both a Revenue Police barracks and an R.I.C. barracks at Crossroads, the latter being located in a building that once stood alongside Danny Collins' Paint shop, on the Station Rd. At a later date the barracks was relocated in what is the Betting Shop, formerly Mc Carthy's. This barracks was surrendered in 1893.

It is of interest to note that during the Land War, on the 19th December 1887, Wybrants Olphert wrote to Balfour, Chief Secretary, explaining his position. In this letter he also makes reference to Mr. Reed. 'No one has better knowledge of this country and on my relations with my tenantry than Mr. Reed, Inspector General of Constabulary, and I trust you will refer to him for further particulars or for verification of my statement.' Therefore, it seems that the granting of land to build a new R.I.C. Barracks in 1891 was a token of appreciation shown to Mr. Reed and the Constabulary for their support throughout the Plan of Campaign. In a letter to the Ramelton Masonic Lodge dated the 30th of July 1864 we find reference to a 'Br. Reed' who wrote a Certificate for Sir John Olphert's entry into the Freemasons. Is this the same Mr. Reed? We also find a note of appreciation given to the same Sir Andrew Reed and the R.I.C. for their cooperation in the horse breeding project of the Congested District Board for Ireland- See Fifth Report, 1896 p. 27. This project set out to improve the breed of horses through the C.D.B.'s district. In 1897, for example the Falcarragh R.I.C. station kept a Welsh Cob. called 'Express IV', during the service season. Premiums were offered by the C.D.B. to locals if their mares foaled by using their stallion. See Sixth Report of Congested District Board p.42.

To the Register of Deeds Ireland.

A memorial of an indenture made 18th day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety one, between Wybrants Olphert of Ballyconnell House in the County of Donegal, Esquire D.L. therein after called the said Lessor which expression was to include the persons or person for the time entitled to the reversing of the hereditaments thereby demised expectant on the term thereby granted where the context so admitted of the one part and Sir Andrew Reed of Dublin Castle the Receiver for the constabulary Force of Ireland appointed under the provisions of an Act made and passed in a session of Parliament held in the sixth year of the reign of his late majesty King William the fourth, Cap. 13. Entitled 'An Act to consolidated the laws relating to the Constabulary Force in Ireland, 'therein after called the said Lessee of the other part.'

Whereby it was witnessed that the said Lessor in exercise of the power for the purpose vested in him under and by virtue of the statue 14, and 15, vic. Chapter 85, and of all other powers if any, there unto enabling for and in consideration of the yearly rent covenants and agreements therein after mentioned Receivers for the Constabulary Force and his and their assigns intrust for her Majesty and her Successors all that and those that plot of ground part of the lands of Ballyconnell containing and not exceeding one acre statue measure situate in the Barony of Kilmacrennan and County Donegal as the same were particularly described on the map coloured red.

To Hold with the appurtenances unto the said Lease as such Receiver as aforesaid and to his successors and his and their assigns in the trust for Her Majesty and her successors for the purpose of the same being occupied for the purposes of the Constabulary Force for the term ninety years from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety one at the yearly rent of eight pound and subject to the several conditions, covenants and agreements therein contained which said indenture as to the execution thereof and his memorial as to the signing and sealing thereof by said Wybrants Olphert are respectively witnessed by Robert H. Beresford, Resident Magistrate, Rathmullen, Co. Donegal, and John Wilkinson, Petty Sessions clerk Falcarragh and which said indenture as to the execution thereof by the said Sir Andrew Reed is witnessed by William Campbell Irish Constabulary office Dublin Castle. Wybrants Olphert sealed, signed by said Wybrants Olphert in the presence of Robert H. Beresford, Resident Magistrate, Rathmullen, Co. Donegal, and John Wilkinson, clerk of the Petty Sessions at Falcarragh. John Wilkson maketh oath and saith that he saw the indenture of which the written writing is a memorial duly executed and the said memorial duly signed and sealed by the name Wybrants Olphert party there to and that the name John Wilkinson subscribed to said indenture and this memorial respectively is his, this deponent proper name and handwriting John Wilkinson sworn at Dunfanaghy in the County of Donegal, 25th day of September, 1891, before me and I know deponent, Chas. A. Ramsay, J.P. for the county of Donegal.

In our house in the late 60s and early 70's – 'The Barracks' was the dominant 'big' building across the road from where we lived, with its rampart high walls that clearly communicated a place of authority and defence while also captivating our curiosity as children. Years later we were pleased that the historical significance of this building was going to be preserved as a heritage site in the parish and for community-based activities which would promote the area, its language and rich traditions. Mam was delighted to serve as one of the co-founding directors in guiding and maintaining this development.

In the early days, my memory is of her attending many many meetings, with decisions after decisions needing to be made, some of which seemingly were not without 'heated debate' on various strategies! She enjoyed working with her fellow directors and was proud of their collective achievement and dedication in bringing the project alive.

Twenty years later, it's a credit to all the directors and management, the focal role that an t-Sean Bheairic performs in Falcarragh and personally it is an honour that mam was part of the team that made this happen. The high walls of the early days are no more, it is no longer a place of authority and defence but a place of open hospitality, local welcome and engaged learning- an important 'home' for us all as a community.

Ag amharc ar ais ar na 25 bliain deireanacha, ón am ar thosaigh muid a chaint ar thionscnamh na Sean Bheairce don chéad uair, tá mé an-bhródúil a bheith páirteach i mbunú agus i stiúradh na Sean Bheairce atá suite i bhfoirgneamh stairiúil bheairic na bpéas ar na Croisbhealaí.

Mar chuid de phlean athnuachana an bhaile de chuid Choiste na dTurasóirí agus na dTrádálaithe, ina raibh forbairt á déanamh ar infreastruchtúr an bhaile, socraíodh go gcuirfí ar bun coiste ar leith le hionad úr a fhorbairt do chuairteoirí agus don phobal áitiúil araon. Ón chéad lá ariamh bhí coiste maith láidir againn leis an tsaothar mhór seo a thiomáint chun tosaigh gur cheannaigh muid an foirgneamh ón OPW agus go ndearnadh an t-athchóiriú agus an t-atógáil agus gur leagadh amach plean maith gnó a bhfuil forbairt ar dóigh déanta ó shin air.

Caithfear a rá go dtug Angela Butler as Baile Átha Cliath cuidiú mór dúinn sna céad laetha sin nuair a rinne sí staidéar ar na féidearthachtaí a bhain le hionad úr ar na Croisbhealaí. Leag sí amach riachtanais an cheantair agus cuireadh le chéile plean don ionad úr bunaithe ar an staidéar seo. Measadh gur cheart

go mbeadh point ar leith ar bhaile le fáilte a chur roimh thurasóirí agus le seirbhísí áirithe a chur ar fáil don phobal. Is é an Fál Carrach an chéad bhaile Gaeltachta a dtig cuairteoirí isteach ann ar a mbealach siar agus ba mhaith linn go mbeadh lárionad ar an bhaile leis an chuid is fearr d'ár gceantar a chur i lár an aonaigh.

Cuireadh ionad ar bun ina mbeadh seomraí ranga, halla imeachtaí, spás cruthaitheach d'ealaíontóirí, caifé agus tuilleadh lena chois sin. Bheadh gné ghnó ag baint leis an ionad fosta, rud a chinnteodh go mbeadh teacht isteach agus sruth airgid ann leis an áit a choinneáil ag gabháil. Cuireadh ar bun siopa ceardaíochta sa tSean Bheairic sa dóigh go dtiocfadh ceardaithe an cheantair agus a gcuid déantús a chur chun tosaigh.

Féadaim a rá gur bhain muid amach ár gcuid cuspóirí go sásúil agus go bhfuil rath agus bláth ar an tSean Bheairic ó shin agus tá súil agam go mbeidh ar feadh i bhfad eile amach anseo.

Looking back on the last 25 years, from the time we first started talking about the Sean Bheairic initiative, I am very proud to be involved in the founding and running of the Sean Bheairic housed in the historic barracks building in Falcarragh.

As part of the Tourist and Traders Committee's town renewal plan, which was developing the town's infrastructure, it was decided to set up a separate committee to develop a new center for both visitors and the local community. From day one we have had a very strong committee to drive forward this project. We bought the building from the OPW and carried out the refurbishment and reconstruction and set out a good business plan that has been developed upon over the years.

It has to be said that Angela Butler from Dublin was a great help to us in those early days when she studied the possibilities of a new centre for Falcarragh. She set out the needs of the area and a plan for the new centre was drawn up based on this study. It was felt that a town should have a special point in welcoming tourists and providing certain services to the public. Falcarragh is the gateway town for visitors to the Gaeltacht.

A venue has been set up with classrooms, an events hall, a creative space for artists, a café, and more. The centre would also have a business element, ensuring revenue and cash flow to keep the venue running. A craft shop was set up in the Old Barracks to promote local artists.

I can say that we have achieved our objectives satisfactorily and that the Sean Bheairic has flourished in the years since and I hope that it will continue for some time to come.

Mary was involved with the Falcarragh Tourist & Traders association and was one of the founding members of An tSean Bheairc, along with her friend Bríd Griffin. Married Hugh Friel, of Radharc an Earagail, Gweedore.

Died in 2015 and was buried with her husband in Magheragallon.

Is minic a chuala mé é (Hughie), a rá (fear na gcnoc as Cúl a' Chnoic, Proclas a bhog cois farraige/íochtar tíre go Droim na Tine in 1919 chuig a ghabháltas talún nuacheannaithe lena bean chéile Kate Gallagher as Mín Doire) agus muid amuigh 'sna cuibhrinn gurbh é port a mháistir ar an Lagan na blianta ó shin ná go raibh “duine ag coimhhead chomh maith le beirt ag obair”

Thiocfaí an Laganach críonna cromtha a shamhailt ag siúl le bata agus píopa ina bhéal ag barr a' pháirc ag glacadh isteach achan rud ina thimpeall agus na céimeanna oibre uilig pleanáilte amach aige do na seachtainí agus míonna amach roimhe.

Chuir an scéal agus an pictiúr sin ag smaoineamh mé ar mo chuimhní féin agus mo dhearcadh faoin choiste a thoisigh amach le seilbh a fháil ar Shean Bheairic na bpéas ar na Croisbhealaigh agus fíis forbartha acu don fhoirgneamh. Bhí fealsúnacht agus tréithe fear a' Lagain go láidir iontu:

- Meascán maith láidir de bhaill coiste
- Lucht cruthaithe gnó an bhaile mhóir
- Dúshlán acu ina gnóithe féin thar na mblianta
- Gan eagla na hoibre orthu
- Taithí forbartha pobail acu tré scéimeanna eile pobail roimhe seo
- Fíis agus fealsúnacht ghnó
- Taithí an tsaoil acu
- Coimeádaithe agus oibrithe den scoth

Ba é an chéad teagmháil a bhí agam le baill den coiste ná cuairt oíche ó Josie agus Séamus Danny leis an sprioc a bhí acu do Bheairic na bPéas a bhí á dhíol ag Bord na nOibreacha Poiblí (OPW) a mhíniú agus cén cuidiú a dtiocfadh le hÚdarás na Gaeltachta a chur ar fáil dá bhfís forbartha. Is cuimhneach liom roinnt cruinnithe eile ina dhiaidh sin i dTeach Tábhairne an Ráca le baill eile an choiste agus Joe é féin (úinéir a' tí) i mbarr a shláinte. Ba léir go raibh tionscnamh tábhachtach, fiúntach acu.



Deirtear sa saol seo go bhfuil an t-am thar a bheith tráthúil agus fíor thábhachtach agus duine ag toiseacht amach le tabhairt faoi thionscnamh – thig leat a bheith ró-luath don dúshlán nó ró-mhall agus an seans imithe ach i gcás na Sean Bheairice thit sé isteach in am trátha a bhí fabhrach.

Bhí straitéis comhthuisceana aontaithe idir an tÚdarás agus an IFI (International Fund for Ireland) le cuidiú le tograí pobalbhunaithe a spreagadh agus comhaoiniú a chur ar fáil le hiad a fhorbairt. Faoin am a thoisigh plé faoin tSean Bheairic bhí roinnt tograí eile ceadaithe ag an Údarás/IFI mar a bhí i gcás:

- An tSean Cheardscoil i Srath na Corcra tré Forbairt Gaoth Dobhair
- Sean Teach Pobail An Clocháin Léith tré Forbairt na Rosann
- Cuid de shean mhonarchan teicstíle Bhaile an Droichid tré Áislann Chill Chartha

Caithfear a rá (diomaite de chúpla babhta sciolladóireachta anois agus arís) go raibh sé éasca agus

Ba mhaith liom aitheantas agus buíochas a thabhairt do Paddy Harte, Comhairleoir Gnó an IFI sa chontae seo le linn na mblianta bheith ag comhoibriú linn san Údarás agus leis na pobail éagsúla fud fad na Gaeltachta nó sna blianta sin gan Paddy agus tacaíocht thábhachtach an IFI ní bheadh mórán den dosaen ionad pobail forbartha nó curtha i gcrích i gceantar Gaeltachta Dhún na Gall.

Joseph P Ferry's father left Falcarragh in Co Donegal for Philadelphia in 1929 and on July 17th, 2006, 77 years on, that journey was reversed when Joseph, now a grandfather sailed his boat, The Falcarragh into Ballyness Bay after 41 days at sea, where a crowd of local people gathered on the pier to meet the son of the town who had completed the epic journey. It was his third attempt to cross the Atlantic in three years and this time he took the most direct route, setting off from Cape May, New Jersey where his father is buried, and heading eastwards, stopping briefly in the Azores for refueling.

Two fishing boats from Inishboffin guided The Falcarragh across Ballyness Bay to the pier at Falcarragh and a delighted Joseph disembarked on home soil.

"I have just arrived in Falcarragh and there is a reception of local people here to meet me and it is just great to be here at last. Mickey Feeney and Tommy McGinley, two Inisboffin fishermen, guided me in across Ballyness Bay to Falcarragh. That was the most tricky part of the journey -- coming in over the bank through Ballyness Bay."



He had hoped to arrive in time for American Independence Day on July 4 but poor weather slowed his progress.

Joe's father was born on a farm that fronts the Atlantic coast, outside Falcarragh. Joe Ferry and his wife, Kitty Gallagher Ferry, once owned a small farm in the Derryveagh Mountains overlooking the sea.

Making a living in Ireland at that time proved to be a challenge, so Ferry and his wife moved back to Philadelphia where he became a parochial school teacher, then a social worker for the City of Philadelphia. They raised three children, Kathleen, Jody, and Danny.

"This Atlantic salt flows in my veins, it is the soup in which my kin's lives have stirred. By no means is my intended trip meant to conquer anything, discover any unknown, or test any mettle. I'd just like to spend some time on the waters between here and then, and maybe close a circle that was opened seventy-five years ago with my father's migration," Joe said before he departed on the trip.

A wise old friend and mentor of mine, PJ Molloy, who many of you will remember, gave me many pieces of advice in his time. When I look back at the work of the International Fund for Ireland, I realise that its success depends heavily on developing strong relationships. In this regard, I cannot overstate the invaluable working relationship between Cathal and myself and many of the staff who worked in Údarás na Gaeltachta during the years that I worked here. We all agreed, that if the Irish language and culture was to survive in the Gaeltacht, then there needed to be vibrant communities where people could make their lives. To achieve that, economic development was crucial and together we set out to identify and support community enterprises powered by local people across the Donegal Gaeltacht.

Solas Donegal is an outdoor walking programme - an ecotherapy programme – which supports people in their mental health recovery. It has developed a very special connection over the years with An tSean Bheairic (The Old Barracks) in Falcarragh, Co. Donegal where it has been based since 2004.

Solas Donegal was the initiative of Falcarragh-based Brendan Hone, a Programme Manager with the HSE. Back in 2003, Brendan sought and managed to secure funding from the HSE for this outdoor recreational programme . . . an innovative programme in Donegal, novel in its approach to mental health recovery (as it was co-designed and delivered with the expertise of people attending mental health services).

The next major step for Brendan was to find a suitable location for Solas. Its base was pivotal to the programme. It had to be somewhere at the heart of a local community, somewhere community-minded and separate to traditional psychiatric services. Fortuitously in 2003, An tSean Bheairic had recently opened in Falcarragh so Brendan approached its committee to enquire about housing the Solas programme. This heritage centre seemed to be the perfect fit. It was community-based with a Café, a Craft shop, a Visitor Information Point, a library and conference facilities. It also delivered adult education classes and courses throughout the year and was operating as a not-for-profit organisation. It was unique too, in that, it was a non-HSE base, separate from traditional mental health services so it provided a discreet base for a programme whose aspiration was to be embedded in the local community. Fortunately, the committee warmly welcomed the proposal and facilitated the service moving into the building

The partnership between the Solas programme and An tSean Bheairic proved harmonious. Any challenges or problems identified by Solas were promptly addressed by the committee; a group composed of local characters who delivered on their word. As a result, the Solas programme became an anchor tenant in the building and remains there to this day.

Solas at Home in An tSean Bheairic

Solas has fully embraced An tSean Bheairic as a community-based location for its Mental Health Recovery programme. The centre's Gaelic culture, welcome and ethos have proven a haven for Solas participants; and a home from home for those of the participants who are bi-lingual.

As an outdoor walking programme, the emphasis of Solas is walking, talking and listening in our beautiful green spaces, and developing therapeutic relationships that support mental health recovery. It is a free, confidential Health Service Executive (HSE) programme for people experiencing mental health difficulties – for example, anxiety, depression – and for people open to attending a programme of group walks in nature to support their recovery.

Solas Donegal has grown and developed over the years and as well as its base in Falcarragh, it is now also based in Buncrana. Additional locations for the programme are currently being developed in Donegal.

Since 2003, hundreds of people have passed through the doors of An tSean Bheairic to join the Solas programme as participants. Its location in the heart of the town is both symbolic and practical, with Mangan's bus stopping right outside the building, ferrying participants to and from Letterkenny and other locations. Its café has provided solace, warmth and much welcome sustenance after a long walk in nature in Donegal's wonderful and varied climate!

The Solas programme is extremely grateful to the committee and staff of An tSean Bheairic for their initial and continued céad míle fáilte. Go raibh míle maith agaibh!

Ghlac mise le post an bhainisteora i samhradh na bliana 2019 agus é mar chúram orm clár oibre ilghnéitheach na Sean Bheairice a reáchtáil. Is maith mar atá ag éirí lenár saothar cé gur am dúshlánach atá ann don tSean Bheairic ó thús na paidéime go luath in 2020.

As a building lying empty, being rescued from dereliction by a foresightful and pioneering local committee, it has changed hugely from being a barracks that housed the RIC in the turbulent years of the land war in the nineteenth century. An tSeán Bheairic was founded for the arrival of the millennium and with support from POBAL, its café, library and other facilities are at the centre of community life today. An tSeán Bheairic has since its foundation, over twenty years ago, provided service in the Irish and English languages to the local community and visitors alike. Everyone is very welcome in An tSeán Bheairic and we make sure that we organise events and opportunities during the year for people who have a variety of interests. Particular support is given to the native language of this Gaeltacht area in the work of An tSeán Bheairic. I took on the position of manager in the summer of 2019 with the responsibility of running the multifaceted programme of An tSeán Bheairic. Our work has seen great success however it has been a challenging time for An tSeán Bheairic since the beginning of the pandemic early in 2020.

Cuireann An tSeán Bheairic clár iomlán oideachais ar fáil d'óg agus aosta, ina measc ranganna ealaíne, ranganna damhsa agus go leor eile. Ní thiocfadh seo a dhéanamh achab é an tacaíocht a bheir an ETB dúinn. Mar chuid thábhachtach dár gclár oideachais agus dár gcuid oibre sa phleanáil teanga, agus le tacaíocht fhiúntach ó Údarás na Gaeltachta,

An tSeán Bheairic provides a full educational programme for young and old, including arts classes dance classes and much else. This would not be possible if it were not for the support of the ETB. Central to our educational programme and to our work in the language planning process are the Irish language classes that we organise with the generous support of Údarás na Gaeltachta. These classes correspond to the TEG (Teastas Eorpach na Gaeilge) format so as participants can work towards a recognised qualification demonstrating their Irish language ability. As well as this, we also organise conversational opportunities for learners of the Irish language.

Cuireann An tSeán Bheairic réimse leathan imeachtaí ar siúl mar chuid dár gclár cultúrtha agus is iomaí sin ceolchoirm agus ceardlann a bhíonn againn le linn na bliana. I gcroílár ár gcláir chultúrtha tá Tionscnamh Éamoinn Ghráinne atá ainmnithe as an cheoltóir agus an seanchaí áitiúil,

Faoin tionscnamh seo, le tacaíocht ó Ealaín na Gaeltachta, cuireann muid ranganna agus ceardlanna san amhránaíocht ar an tsean-nós, sa damhsa ar an tsean-nós agus sa scéalaíocht thraidisiúnta ar siúl sa tSean Bheairic féin agus i scoileanna i bparóiste Chloich Cheann Fhaola.

Also, we organise a wide array of events as part of our cultural programme and we hold many's a concert and a workshop throughout the year. At the heart of our cultural programme is Tionscnamh Éamoinn Ghráinne, named after local singer, musician and seanchaí, Eamonn Ghráinne Mac Ruairí. As part of this project, with the support of Ealaín na Gaeltachta, we hold classes and workshops in sean-nós singing, dancing and traditional storytelling both inside An tSean Bheairic agus in local schools in the parish of Cloich Cheann Fhaola.

Achan bhliain eagraíonn muid Féile na Sean Bheairice, a bhíonn ar siúl i mí an Mheithimh de ghnáth, ina ndéantar ceiliúradh ar an amhránaíocht agus ar an damhsa ar an tsean-nós agus ina léirítear cineálacha úra ceoil fosta. Mar chuid de Fhéile na Sean Bheairice bíonn Corn Éamoinn Ghráinne san amhránaíocht ar an tsean-nós ar

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siúl agus Corn na Sean Bheairice sa
damhsa ar an tsean-nós. I mí na
Nollag eagraíonn muid Féile
Scéalaíochta na Glaise i gcomhpháirt
le Coiste Fhéile Scéalaíochta na
Glaise agus bíonn imeachtaí agus
comórtais scéalaíochta d'óg agus
aosta ar siúl i rith na féile sin. Lena
chois sin, is gnáth go mbíonn
imeachtaí de chuid Fhéile Ealaíne an

Oidhreacht Thulacha Bheigile agus
FestiFál againn sa tSean Bheairic.

Every year we organise Féile na Sean Bheairice, which is usually held in June, during which the local community celebrates the strong traditions of sean-nós singing and dancing and in which we also host other forms of

contemporary music. As part of Féile na Sean Bheairice we hold Corn Éamoinn Ghráinne, our local competition for sean-nós singers, and Corn na Sean Bheairice, our competition for sean-nós dancers. In December we co-organise Féile Scéalaíochta na Glaise

with Coiste Fhéile Scéalaíochta na Glaise. This storytelling festival is a great opportunity to experience the best of Donegal's Irish language storytellers at our events and competitions. We also host events for the Errigal Arts Festival, Féile Nasc na nGael, Wainfest, Féile na Bealtaine, Culture Night, Tullaghobegly Heritage Walking Weekend



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and FestiFál.

Tá coiste agus foireann na Sean Bheairice ag dúil go mór le neart blianta rathúla amach anseo ag déanamh seirbhíse do phobal an Fháil Charraigh agus Chloich Cheann Fhaola agus do chuairoteoirí chun an cheantair.

The board and staff of An tSean Bheairic look forward to many more successful years serving the communities of An Fál Carrach and Cloich Cheann Fhaola agus visitors to the area.
